Heidelberg catechism (1563)

Question: What does God require in the fifth commandment?

<u>Answer</u>: That I show all honor, love, and faithfulness to my father and mother and to all those in authority over me, submit myself with due obedience to their good instruction and discipline, and also have patience with their weaknesses and shortcomings, since it is God's will to govern us by their hand.

While we are called in Scripture to honor all people (12:17), here in commandment 5 we are especially called
