It now is impossible for her sins to destroy her, for they are laid on Christ and swallowed up by Him. She has her righteousness in Christ, her husband which she now can boast is her very own. She can set this righteousness over against all of her sins, and in the face of death and hell, say with confidence: 'If I have sinned, nevertheless, the One in whom I trust, my Christ, has not sinned.
