4. The Seven Cycles of Revelation

-Revelation 1-3, Christ among the lampstands-Christ is the Lord of the Church. He knows each and every church. He sees _______ the strengths and weaknesses of every congregation. He guides and directs His church with His word-words of blessing and words of rebuke. Just because He ascended does not mean He is not present among His churches.

-Revelation 4-7, The seven seals-Before we approach the trials of life, we must first get a heavenly perspective. The heavenly perspective is that Christ (the Lamb who was slain but is living) is the Lord. He is over all the events of _______. The seals show us the trials of life but remind us that those who are sealed by God will persevere and find themselves standing at the end (Psalm 1:5).

-Revelation 8-11, The seven trumpets-The trumpets of judgement represent the judgments of God on the wicked that are a call to repent now before the end. However, those whose names are not written in the book of life will only continue to _______ their hearts against the Lord and will not repent. In fact, the enemy will attack the church (after it has finished its work) and seem to win the victory. However, the church will be victorious in the end as Christ comes back in judgment upon the beast and those who bear his mark.

-Revelation 12-14, The war behind it all-The reason the devil rages against Christians is because the devil has been ______ by Christ. Satan could not defeat the Christ, so he rages against His people. He rages by using the beast (persecution), the false prophet (false religion), and the harlot (material seduction) to wage war on the church. But in the end the Lord's people will be rescued and the enemies of God's people are trodden in the wine press of God's wrath.

-Revelation 15-16, The seven bowls-These judgments of God are poured out on the _______ wicked. When the wicked do not respond to the trumpets of judgment God pours forth the bowls of wrath. Again, as has already been seen several times, in the end the enemies of God's people perish, and His people are rescued.

-Revelation 17-19, The fall of beast, the false prophet, and the great harlot-The enemies of God's people are one by one being shown to be defeated. All of the enemies of Christ and His Church will be ______, and His people will be the ones rejoicing in the end. The joy of the saints will not only be in the victory of Christ over His adversaries, but their joy will be complete as they experience the bliss of communion with their Groom for all eternity.

-Revelation 20-22, The end of Satan and beginning of endless joy for the saints-Satan is the last of the enemies of God's people to be seen defeated. Christ is Lord and His victory will be seen. He will not only throw Satan into the lake of fire but also all the wicked human beings. But the saints will stand in the judgement not being judged for ______ deeds but being judged by the deeds of ______. Christ and His bride will enjoy the beauty of life evermore in the presence of God-and they will be His people and He will be their God. This is the glorious future for the saints. We long for that day and say with the apostle of old "Amen. Come Lord Jesus."
