Edward	ls wants us to consider 6 different truths that support this doctrine.
1.	Heaven is the place where the Being who is the fountain of love resides - "The God of love dwells in heaven. Heaven is the palace, or presence-chamber, of the Supreme Being who is both the cause and of all holy love."
"God is	s the fountain of love, as the sun is the fountain of light. And therefore the glorious presence of God in heaven heaven with love, as the sun placed in the midst of the hemisphere in a clear day fills the world with light."

Those	who "are entitled to heaven" are those who:
	A. Have the love of God implanted in them through regeneration- "Their hearts are a soil in which this heavenly seed has been sown and in which it abides. And so they are changed, and of earthly are become heavenly in their dispositionsTheir are drawn to God and Christ, and for their sakes flow out to the saints in humble and spiritual love."
	B. Have freely chosen the happiness of heaven above all others- "The world does not afford anything like it. They have chosen this before any other. Their souls go out after it more than any other, and their hearts are more in pursuit of it than any other. They have chosen it freely, nor merely because they have met with such sorrow, and are in such low and afflicted circumstances, that they do not expect much from the world. But their hearts are so by this good that they choose it for its own sake beyond all worldly good, if they had ever so much of it, and could enjoy it ever so long."
	C. Are struggling after holiness- "Holy love makes them long for holiness. Divine love is a principle, which after increaseLove is a holy fire in him."
